The Piedmont Area Jr. Livestock Show is held each year in May at the Blackstone Livestock Market.

4-H and FFA youth (ages 9-19) exhibit in competition beef, swine, sheep and goat projects. Market class project animals are sold. Non-Market class project animals are not sold.

Exhibitors care for and train their animals on a daily basis with projects lasting from four months to a year, depending on species. The show competition allows them to learn from their peers and reinforces the value of preparation and hard work.

Why Do Exhibitors Require Sponsorship?

Exhibitors, or their family, must purchase their own animals for their projects. Show animals generally require a premium price for quality animals of the proper age. Exhibitors pay for all the feed and supplies necessary to prepare the animals for show. Exhibitors are encouraged to obtain sponsorship from their local community to help defray the costs of their livestock projects.


