Are you interested in raising your own sheep or goats? Join us in Cumberland, Virginia for a class on starting out with small ruminants. Sheep and goats can be raised to provide meat, milk, and fiber. They can be raised for 4-H Projects, clearing brush from an area or simply as pets. If you're interested in raising sheep and goats for meat, this class covers all the basics you will need to start your enterprise.

- Starting a farm business: insurance, tax, and legal considerations
- Everything you need to know to raise sheep and goats: breed selection, housing, supplies/equipment, fencing, feeding, and marketing
- Health of your sheep and goats
- Reproduction: to include preparing for lambing and kidding
- Hands-on activities: including hoof trimming, body condition scoring, correct drenching techniques, lambing, FAMACHA, etc. (Please dress warmly as the afternoon portion of the workshop will be held at a local producer's farm.)
